THE 2025 EPISCOPAL CONVENTION

THE THEME OF OUR 2025 CONVENTION is Hope & Healing: Engaging Indigenous Cosmologies & the Gospel in Action. The convention this year is in partnership with the *Episcopal Divinity School*, where for those of you who know *Lydia Bucklin*, she is now their dean.

Pls. be clear that you can register on the site *upepiscopal.org* and all the docs are also available there. The convention doesn't begin in Escanaba, this year, but at the Terrace Bay Inn in Gladstone from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm. It is a day long Hope & Healing Workshop with Sarah Augustine and Sheri Hostetler, co-founders of the Coalition to Dismantle the Doctrine of Discovery and authors of So We and Our Children May Live: Following Jesus in Confronting the Climate Crisis.

After that, the convention is held *St. Stephen's* for an evening session where if you join you will create a non-traditional liturgy together and celebrate Eucharist together in Canterbury Hall. The convention then will start the next day, *Sat. Oct. 18th at Bay Col-*

lege 2001 N Lincoln Road, Escanaba at 8:30 am with refreshment sand the more traditional meeting will begin at 9am with Bishop's address, nominations, elections, reports and proposed budgets etc. with the convention itself ending at 2:15pm however, at 2:30 a seminar on mutual ministry if offered for visitors.

I hope if you are curious you will have the courage to try it out and go and see what it is about. When I have attended, I have never had a bad time and it has always been interesting. \diamondsuit

ABOUT LANI'S CONCERT

THE REV. MO ASKED me at our communication's meeting on 9/24 what my concert was about and if it had a theme, and I replied that yes, it did and I know what it is, but I wouldn't be able to communicate it in the program notes for the concert because they were only about the music and there wasn't enough space etc. or time for *me* and like so many things we all talk about, it just sort of wafted gently out the window....

LET ME MAKE SURE you have the basics: I am *Lani*, who doubles as your newsletter editor, but I also am a pianist and usually more formal if I play a concert so the poster and program

will say "Leonore Hall" who is the same person as "Lani". I would love for you all to enjoy the concert and it will be held: at 5PM on Sunday, Oct. 12th in the Nave at St. Stephen's. Afterwards will be a Short Reception.

THE THEME OF THE CONCERT is, about being old now and looking back at your childhood and understanding what it was. As you may know, I grew up in Escanaba, so my music exposure was probably somewhat short-sighted, as I am now learning, from doing this recital. We didn't have internet in those days, so for ex., most of the music that I'll be performing, such as Debussy: Children's Corner Suite, which is an awesome set of pieces, I 'pecked at' when I was a child, but didn't know it wasn't written for children!! Nor did anyone else. So I thought there was something wrong with me because I couldn't play it very well! That's why it was so *hard* to play!!

THE LIST GOES ON.... I feel so fortunate now that I don't have to struggle, at least, with piano, as I did then! It has taken me until age 70 to realize that and after not performing

for a good 20 years, I had to go back into myself and do these investigative realizations via learning this recital. I don't think it was on anyone's agenda, including my own, for me to do this, but, sometimes 'you gotta do the work' to discover anything worthwhile about yourself. Life is a creative process for all of us.
